We have had some cases of head lice reported in school. This is a fairly common occurrence in schools but there is a need to catch all cases in the early stages to prevent lice from spreading.


Please can you remind your child not to share hairbrushes, combs, hats etc. I would also encourage you to check your child's hair regularly and should you discover any lice then please treat appropriately.

Staff Development

This week staff had the second part of their bar modelling training. It focused on the ability to compare, discuss and inquire. We also looked at the use of Cuisenaire rods in class to aid children's understanding and how to use a bar model to represent problems.

School Car Park

If you are visiting school and there are no free allocated car parking spaces please park off site. There is strictly no parking on the grass area, other than that designated for parking, as this is now being used by children and we do not want the grass to become waterlogged.





Good to be Green

Following the success of last year's 'Good to be Green' events, which were designed to reward children with good behaviour throughout the term, SLT along with class teachers have decided to run the scheme again this year.

Having listened to comments and feedback from parents with regard to the way the system worked, we have made some alterations to encourage children to adhere to the behaviour policy throughout the terms.

Each half term will have a dedicated afternoon for 'Good to be Green' celebrations to take place, the first being on Friday 20 October. Our school council are currently looking into what activities and treats the children can take part in; I believe one suggestion is a Pyjama Party afternoon!

To make things simpler for the children, we have adapted the way the red and yellow warnings are deducted from the main 'Good to be Green' event.

For every yellow warning that is issued, 20 minutes will be deducted; for every red warning 40 minutes will be deducted. These deductions will be taken from the start of the 'Good to be Green' event.

So for example, if your son / daughter receives 1 yellow and 1 red warning within the first half term prior to the 'Good to be Green' event, they will have a total of an hour deducted from the start of the activity, so if it's due to start at 1.15pm they won't join until 2.15pm.

We hope, by introducing this new system, it will encourage the children to stay in line with the behaviour policy. However, should they receive a warning we hope that children have the opportunity to join their peers after they have reflected on their behavioural choices.
